# **POSITION DESCRIPTION**

Under general supervision, this position supervises the Sheriff's Office mechanic personnel and the operation of the repair facility and performs skilled mechanical repair work. Performs other duties as required. Subject to being called back for emergency situations. This position is supervised by the Sheriff's Office Services Sergeant.

#### WORK PERFORMED

- **40%** Supervision. Supervises the Mechanic II and/or Mechanic III positions and others with respect to accountability for performance and behavior including approval of absences to conform to personnel needs, discipline of employees, staff development and training, completion of performance evaluations and other personnel related functions. Participates in the hiring and promotional process. Instructs staff on proper completion of tasks. Inspects and reviews work of staff to ensure that projects are complete. Establishes work schedules and assigns work. Checks work procedures and products. Supervises the servicing of equipment and inspects tools and equipment for proper use and care.
- **20%** Installation. Installs, services, diagnoses and repairs emergency vehicle equipment and related equipment including, but not limited to, light bars, in-car video, two-way mobile radios, light and siren controllers, K-9 deployment systems, antenna systems, LED warning lights, prisoner transport systems, and mobile computers. Trains subordinates on repair and installation of equipment.
- **20%** Inventory, Purchasing, and Paperwork. Oversees the purchasing of shop supplies and automotive repair parts. Prepares the necessary automotive work orders. Prepares the necessary purchase requests and submits them for approval. Provides budgetary input for fleet supplies and vehicle purchases. Maintains an ongoing inventory of fleet vehicles. Assists in writing specifications for emergency equipment, shop equipment, and automotive equipment.
- **15%** Maintenance/Repairs. Performs standard vehicle maintenance including, but not limited to, changing oil, changing, repairing, and mounting/balancing tires, lubricating, suspensions, inspecting and replacing filters, and checking and filling fluid levels. In addition, oversees the cloud based management system for in-car cameras, in car Wi-Fi and cellular data connectivity. Additionally, performs repair work and the overhaul and maintenance of all types of automotive and diesel equipment as needed.
- 5% Inspections and Safety. Inspects equipment to determine need of repair and prepares necessary work orders. Enforce safety regulations. Assists in writing specifications for safety and automotive equipment. Assists in designing and supervising fabrication of new and special equipment.
